## Market overview

The equity market rallied to start the year amid rising interest rates, as investors digested stronger-than-expected inflation readings. While the year-over-year downward trend in inflation remained in place, the futures market signaled three 2024 rate cuts at first-quarter end, down from six rate cuts that were priced in at the beginning of the year. At the March FOMC meeting, the Federal Reserve slightly increased its projections of near-term inflation and longer-run policy rates, recognizing that current economic data may warrant extending restrictive policy. Accordingly, the 10-year Treasury yield increased 0.37%, after a 0.69% fourth-quarter decline. During the first quarter, the S&P 500® gained 10.6%, reaching an all-time high. Strength was broad-based, as 10 out of 11 sectors in the S&P 500 advanced. Five sectors posted double-digit gains, including communication services (15.8%), energy (13.7%), information technology (12.7%), financials (12.5%) and industrials (11.0%). Real estate was the only sector that was relatively flat during the quarter (-0.6%).

## Performance

Powered by a daily covered call strategy that sells one-day call options each day, ISPY's index, the S&P 500 Daily Covered Call Index, outperformed a traditional monthly strategy index, the CBOE S&P 500 BuyWrite Index, by 2.4% during the first quarter (8.5% vs. 6.0%). Over the same period, ISPY's index underperformed the S&P 500 by 2.1% (8.5% vs. 10.6%). In terms of income, the annualized index yield\* for the first quarter was 10.2%.




## Performance contribution

ISPY follows a strategy that consists of a long position in the S&P 500 Total Return Index and a short position in a one-day, out-of-the-money S&P 500 call option. The strategy's performance can be broken into the following components: 1) S&P 500 price return, 2) S&P 500 dividends, 3) daily call premiums, and 4) the payouts required when options sold expire in-the-money.

During the quarter, the strategy saw gains of approximately 10.2% from S&P 500 price return. Net of daily call payouts totaling -4.4%, the strategy's price return contribution for the quarter was 5.8%. As for income, ISPY's strategy saw gains of 0.4% from S&P 500 dividends and gains of 2.3% from daily call premiums, bringing the total income contribution for the quarter to 2.7%. Combining the contributions of price return and income, the strategy had an 8.5% total return.
